

COLOR TV DELAY ASKED

F. C. C. Urged to Postpone Final Action Until Next June

WASHINGTON, Oct. 5 (AP)—The Radio Corporation of America today asked the Federal Communications Commission to postpone final action on color television until June 30, 1951. Motorola, Inc., of Chicago, one of the larger set-makers, at the same time filed a separate plea for further hearings.

The commission last month tentatively selected the color plan sponsored by the Columbia Broadcasting System for commercialization. That tentative decision ruled out the competing color systems developed by R. C. A. and Color Television, Inc., of San Francisco.
