

## F. C. C. BARS VIDEO MOVE

### Refuses to Allow Intervention in Color Hearings

WASHINGTON, Feb. 23 (AP) — The Federal Communications Commission refused today to permit the Emerson Radio and Phonograph Corporation, New York, to intervene in its color television proceedings.

The company had asked that Dorman D. Israel, executive vice president, be permitted to testify when hearings are resumed next Monday on whether color TV is ready for the public.

The FCC recited the steps that have already been taken in the proceedings and said the proposed testimony would not be warranted in view of the FCC's desire to reach a decision as early as possible. The commission said the Emerson petition would not relate to a specific color television system or be based upon tests conducted by the company.
