Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute has announced that two members of the teaching staff at the Troy, New York institution have developed an entirely new, all-electronic color television system. Stations transmit color signals which can be picked up by present-type black and white sets and receivers designed to receive color. An adaptation of the device can be attached to motion picture cameras to permit color pictures to be taken with black and white film.
